Historic Information: In November of 1880, August Pische bought Lot 2, Block 17 from Christopher Carli. He, in turn sold the lot to James Pische who sold it to Llewellyn Staples in 1889. Staples hired Stillwater contractor, William Bieging, to build him a \$500 one-and-a-half story house 14-feet by 24 feet by 26 feet. Staples was a clerk at the Schulenburg & Boeckeler Lumber Company. The house remains at 1214 N. First Street.
