Historic Information: Lydia Carli sold Gustav A. Ruehle the west one-half of Lot 3, Block 17 in the spring of 1896. Ruehle, who had previously lived at 1302 N. Second Street, moved into his new home at 214 E. Stillwater Street in the later part of 1896. Gustav worked for the Chicago St Paul Milwaukee & Omaha Railway. Today this home has been meticulously refurbished by its present owners, and probably looks better now than when it was new.
