Historic Information: John Glaspie, a local real estate dealer who lived at 719 S. Third St., and his wife, Kate, purchased Lots 9, 10, & 11 from the Stillwater Construction and Furnishing Company for \$900 in May, 1889. In turn, they sold part of Lots 9 & 10 to James and Ellen Dwyer in July of 1890. Either the Glaspies or the Dwyers built the house at 806 South Second Street between 1889 and 1891.
