Historic Information: Edward Stewart, a lumberman, obtained the Warranty Deed for Lots 3 & 4, Block 13, in the spring of 1874, and, the tax assessor's record indicates, built a home soon afterwards. When house numbers were assigned a decade later, this house took the number, 910 South Third Street. The present house on these two lots, 906 South Third Street, was built in 1906 by Frank Linner & Co. for Mrs. Ida Johnson. The house cost \$3,000, was 30 feet by 40 feet with a mansard roof. It also had indoor plumbing: two water closets, two wash basins, one enameled iron sink and a bath tub.
