**Historic Information:** John Gieriet purchased Lots 8 & 9, Block 13, in June of 1876, and he built a substantial house — which later took the number, 1002 South Third Street — within a year. Apparently his residence was in question, for in 1877, he filed a homestead declaration on his property. John ran a “saloon and billiards” on the corner of Main and Chestnut Streets.
