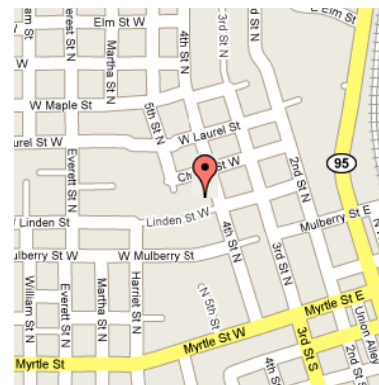

Narrative:

This elegant, Italianate style house was constructed circa 1868 for Jotham and Mary Lowell. The two-story, frame home has

clapboard siding with corner boards, two-over-two double-hung windows, a front gable roof, and a full-width front porch with a hip roof. The shallow-pitch, pedimented front gable, overhanging eaves with decorative brackets and dentils, and the tall and narrow windows are characteristics of the Italianate style that was popular in the United States from the approximately 1840 until around 1885. The one-story, rectangular bays on the north and south elevations are another common feature of Italianate style houses. The front porch has turned columns and spindles that are evocative of the Queen Anne style and indicate that these features replaced earlier Italianate elements. A one-and-a-half-story, gable roofed wing on the rear elevation was built contemporaneously with the house. According to the 1876-1877 city directory, Jotham Lowell owned a store at the corner of Myrtle that sold general merchandise. By 1890, Jotham passed away, leaving Mrs. Lowell to live in the house alone.
