**Historic Information:** Adam Johnson worked as a carpenter for Stillwater Manufacturing Company. Chances are he built this house himself, beginning with an abbreviated \$100 structure. He lived there for more than a decade. In 1910, a bathroom was added to the house by its then owner, Peter Mattson, who also made other repairs in 1923 and 1925.
