Historic Information: This house does not appear on the 1892 Map of Dutchtown, and the Tax Assessor's office gives a building date of 1908. Robert Anderson who grew up in the house is uncertain about whether the house was built, or whether it was moved in. The simple symmetrical style of the house, typical of other Dutchtown houses built in the 1870's or before, seems to belie that later building date. My guess is that the house was moved in to that lot about 1908.
